## Did You Know?

Residents of Santa Monica, both homeowners and apartment dwellers, can now have household hazardous waste picked up at your door. This includes everything from paint and pesticides to electronics. The service is free but there may be a few days wait for a pick up.

The new service is provided in a few easy steps:

1. Reserve collection service: call 1 (800) HHW-PKUP (1.800.449.7587), Monday-Friday, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM; or e-mail [hotline@curbsideinc.com](mailto:hotline@curbsideinc.com);
2. Receive collection kit in the mail (includes detailed instructions with collection day reminder);
3. Prepare collection kit at your doorstep or at a predetermined location on collection day;
4. Leave prepared materials and we'll do the rest!
